The Franz Liszt Story is the first film based on the life of a classical composer in fifteen years and should strike a receptive chord among music lovers with its display of true beauty and the musical form. The importance of the man Franz Liszt and his music can never be overemphasized. He was, and still is, considered the outstanding musical personality of a period famed for a plethora of musicians destined for immortality. Among his contemporaries are such hallowed names as Richard Wagner, Frederic Chopin, Robert Schumann, Felix Mendelssohn and Johannes Brahms; but of them all, the Hungarian born romanticist stood tallest as a genius, both as a serious composer and concert pianist. As a citizen of all nineteenth-century Europe, Liszt lived a tempestuous life torn between religion and music and woven around two great loves. It is this music and these loves on which the movie SONG WITHOUT END is based.

Each of the songs herein is an adaptation of a notable Liszt composition especially arranged for this album by Harry Sukman, composer of the background score for the film. Titles of seven of Liszt's time tested works have been changed or translated into English to conform with the picture. Three others, however—Liebestraum, Hungarian Fantasy and Concerto No. 1—were considered too well established to be retitled.

The Franz Liszt Story was a labor of love for me as well as for Harry Sukman, talented concert pianist in his own right who has made a lifelong study of Liszt and his techniques.
